Zachariah Ivy b-abt 1789 South Carolina d- 1851 Winston County, MS m- 1809 to Elizabeth Lancaster b-1790 Lancaster, South Carolina d-abt 1870 Pickensville, Pickens, AL. The reason she moved to Pickensville after Zach's death is unknown, she may have had family there or other kin. They also lived in Cherokee and Etowah counties Alabama.

A short history of Zachariah Ivey

15 Jun 1809 Lancaster, SC, land- witness: Henry Massy, Robert Ivey, Zachariah Ivey, witness sale of land from Amey Ivey to David Shepherd and wife Charlotte.

5 Jun 1809 Lancaster, SC, witness sale of land to Jesse Ivy

War of 1812 Lancaster, SC 2nd Reg't [McWillie's] South Carolina Militia rank Private

6 Oct 1814 South Carolina, private served in Capt. John Montgomery's Company from 6 Oct 1814 to 4 Jan 1815, Mackey Todd substitute.

2 Oct 1815 SC; witness to land sale; Wike Ivey, Moses Heath, and Zachariah Ivy witnessed sale of land from Amey Ivey to Jeremiah Cureton.

1824, Union, SC; estate-- requested money for keep of his mother. Heirs of Amey challenged, witnesses Whitlock, Griffin, Tracy, Ennis, Adams

27 Sep 1827 Union, SC Land-- Attested deed Amey Ivey made to Jeremiah Cureton for 136 acres in Lancaster County, SC on 15 Oct 1815

4 Jan 1827 Union, SC witness purchase of land by Absalom Ivey from Freeman Bentley witness: Zachariah Ivey, James Ivey, John Haney

The 1830 Census has him in Union County, South Carolina with two boys between 10 and 15 years of age and two girls under five years of age and two girls 15 to 20 years of age no names are given

29 Oct 1834 Union, SC sold land to Fleming Harris for \$200.00

On the 1840 census Zach and family are in Pickensville, Pickens, Alabama

1 Sep 1845 Purchased land from GLO [General Land Office] now BLM [Bureau of Land Management]

1 Jun 1845 land from GLO [BLM] Etowah, AL

1 Sep 1848 Winston County, MS land from GLO [BLM]

In 1853 Elizabeth, Catherine, T.J., and Samuel along with cousins Howell and L.E. Ivey, shown in Winston County, MS. This information is from the 1805 - 90 Mississippi Census. They had 9 children 5 girls and 4 boys 1. Nancy 2. Martha [Patsy] 3. Jesse 4. Samuel 5. Mary "Polly" Ivy 6. Jane P. 7. Thomas J. 8. Ann Sabella 9. William
