The most likely scenario is that they either lived together and then got married when they got to Mississippi.

2. Martha "Patsy" Ivy, daughter of Zachariah Ivy, b- 1812 South Carolina d- aft 1880. In 1880 she lived with her brother Thomas J. and his family until her death some time after 1880. She never married.

Ivy, son of Zachariah Ivy, b- 27 Nov 1817 South Carolina d- 14 Oct 1852 Winston County, MS burial Antioch Cemetery, Winston County, MS m- Catherine Harper b- 1820 Georgia d- aft 1880 m- ? no record of marriage or date known; buried Antioch Cemetery, Winston County, MS. Ivy, b- 14 Mar 1841 Alabama d- 22 Dec 1908 [Jackson County, AR ? this is unverified] Winston County, MS m - 7 May 1868 to Mary Ann Kinard b- 26 Mar 1846 Winston County, MS d- 30 Oct 1936 Winston County, MS. Both are buried in Betheden Lutheran Cemetery, Betheden, Winston MS.

Chris served in the Confederate States Army during the Civil War ( The War of Northern Aggression) along with several members of his family. He entered as a Private and was discharged as a Sergeant at the end of the war. He and Thomas J. enlisted in the Barksdale Grays as privates. The Barksdale Grays were organized 25 May 1861 and officially known as the 20th Mississippi Infantry " G " Company. At some later date he joined Company " F " 5th Mississippi Infantry and later Company " A " 9th Battalion
